Agricultural burns <ul style="list-style-type: none"> includes the burning of diseased crops, orchard prunings, crop stubble, weeds, pest animal habitat and pasture for regenerative purposes, and the clearing of land for commercial agriculture. does NOT include the burning of packaging associated with agricultural operations, vegetation accumulated from land clearing for commercial property development, domestic refuse or private garden green waste. 	Not Required where the property is zoned rural and is used for agricultural purposes	Nil
Burning to demolish a building or other building materials	NOT PERMITTED in Blacktown, Fairfield and Penrith	Nil
Burning stock animals that have died or have died due to disease	Not Required where the property is zoned rural and is used for agricultural	Nil
Camp fire for cooking or heating <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A recreational fire is a small fire used for cooking or heating. Is to be used within an established fireplace or camp site. Requires a cleared 2 metres around the fire Does NOT include burning leaves & other garden refuse 	Not Required	Nil
Burning of prohibited articles; <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Tyres Coated wire Paint containers and residues 	PROHIBITED IN ALL AREAS	Nil
Burning to clear native vegetation	Approval under the <i>Native Vegetation Conservation Act</i>	Department of Infrastructure Planning and Natural Resources
Burning piles of vegetation resulting from development	NOT PERMITTED in Blacktown, Fairfield and Penrith	Nil
